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To bath (*ba:θ*) - To bathe (*beɪð*)

To bath: Wash yourself in the tub, to get clean.

To bathe: Immerse, immerse, physically or metaphorically, in something; to apply a liquid for healing or soothing.

- **Bath** the baby, wash his face carefully.
- She **bathed** in the reflected glory of her husband's Nobel award!
- She opted for the warm **bath** again.
- **Bathe** the wound in iodine.
- Jane and Mark went **bathing** in the pond.

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Human chronic wound macrophage bathing

Monocytes and macrophages are plastic cells whose functions are governed by microenvironmental cues. Wound fluid bathing the wound tissue reflects the wound microenvironment. Current literature on wound inflammation is primarily based on the study of blood monocyte-derived macrophages, cells that have never been exposed to the wound microenvironment.

In the bathroom

There are two main uses for the bathroom. One is to have a shower or bath to clean yourself. The other is to go to the toilet.

When you want to clean yourself, you use the shower (where you stand up) or the bathtub (where you sit in a lot of water).

Almost every house has a shower. This is where you clean yourself by standing in a cubicle where water comes out of a shower head which is situated on the wall above your head.

Sometimes the shower is not in a cubicle but combined with a bathtub.

When this happens, you usually need a shower curtain so that the water doesn't splash onto the bathroom floor.
